After the syllabus was put into implementation, the teachers of Economics at the Under graduate level noticed that there were some lacunae. The Board in the special meeting held on 13.4.2009 thoroughly examined the draft syllabus, made necessary improvements and approved the updated syllabus in the light of Revised Regulations Governing Credit Based Semester Scheme for Bachelor Degree Programmes in the Faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce notified through MU/Academic/CRA/2008-09/A2., dated 26.2.2009 for the following Semesters:
