# 1. Quiz Competition :

- Group consists of two members
- Topics are related to-General Knowledge, Recent Political Affairs, and culture
- Medium used will be English
- Nature of rounds will be decided by the quiz master
- The decision of the quiz master will be final
- Prelims will be conducted prior to the competition to select the teams for the final contest.
- Maximum two groups from a class.

### 2. Fancy Dress Competition

- Conducted at individual and group level
- A group can consist maximum of 5 members
- > No dialogue or speaking is allowed
- ➤ No use of animals, birds and fire
- ➤ Avoid negative characterization as drunkards, beggars, etc.,
- > Time allowed is 3 minutes for group, 1 minute for individual
- ➤ Judged on the basis of originality and creativity, costumes, effective performance.
- > Do not insult any caste or community

# 3. Singing Competition: Individual "Kannada Bhavageetha"

- > Time given is 5 minutes
- Participant should mention the name of the "POET"
- > Judged on the basis of lyrics and performance.

# 4. Singing Competition-Individual-Popular Songs :

- > Time given is 5 minutes.
- Songs may be selected from any language
- Judged on the basis of quality of the song, and performance

# 5. Folk Songs Competition (Group)

- Group of 7+2 for instrumentals if any
- > Time given is 5 minutes
- Songs related to Karnataka culture is preferred
- Judged on the basis of quality of the song, performance and costume

### 6. Skit Competition : (Group)

- A group should consist of minimum 5 members and maximum of 10
- Fine allowed is 8 minutes.
- No use of animals, birds and fire
- Avoid negative characterization as drunkards, beggars, etc.,
- > Judged on the basis of originality and creativity, costumes, effective performance.
- Do not insult any caste or community

### 7. Mono Acting (Individual)

- $\triangleright$  Time allotted is 4 +1 minutes
- Participant can speak either in Kannada, English or Hindi
- > Judged on the basis of theme, Language and acting.
- ➤ Avoid negative characterization as drunkards, beggars, etc.,

### 8. Folk Dance

- A group should consist of min 6 members and maximum 10.
- Time allowed is 6 minutes.
- > Judged on the basis of originality and creativity costumes, effective performance.
- Weight-age is given to live songs.
- **>** Boys and `Girls cannot dance together.
- > Language is no bar.
- Fire and animals not allowed on stage.
