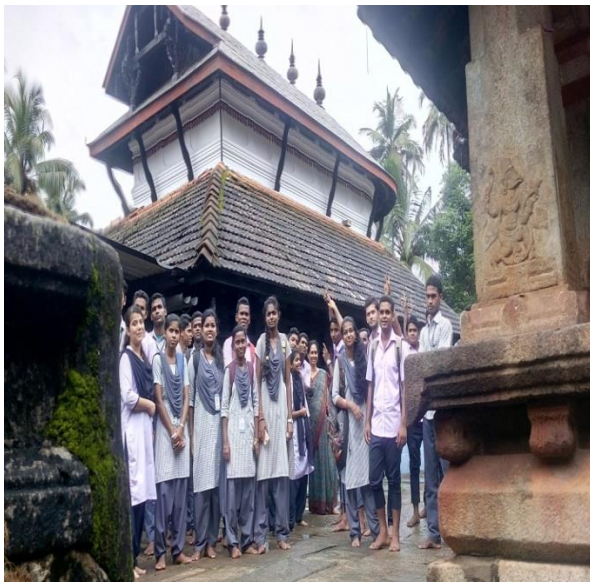


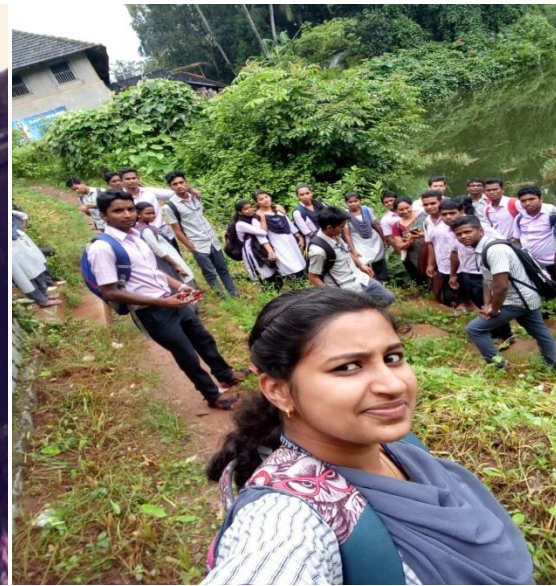

It was a wonderful experience for the students and they learnt about cropping pattern, problems the farmers face, diseases of Pepper, areca nut and coconut plants, when to manure, when to spray pesticides and insecticides, and how much irrigation is needed etc.





EDUCATION TOUR BY FLIGHT(6th & 7th September 2018)

The Final Year B.A students of Milagres College Kallianpur recently had a wonderful, pleasant and first of its kind in the history, an education tour by flight. It was organized by the Humanities Association of the college with an objective of exposing rural students to the urban life. The flight journey by IndiGo Airlines was from Mangaluru International airport to Bangalore Kempegowda International Airport on 6th of September morning. The tour covered trial ride by Namma Metro from Cubbon Park station to Halasuru and back, visit to HAL Helicopter Museum, Visvesvaraya Industrial and Technological museum, Freedom Park, Lalbaugh, Govt. Aquarium, Vidhana Soudha and High Court, The Koramangala Recreation Club, UB City, Mantri Mall, Majestic Bus Station etc.

It gave an unique experience to the students of flying by an aircraft. The tour had its intended outcome of becoming aware of career opportunities in Aviation and Hospitality industry. The prime objective was to give them visual and practical experience on passenger safety, alternative entertainment and leisure opportunities available for urban population, rapid transport system as solution for traffic congestion, pollution forms and its control, history of India's Freedom Struggle etc. An onsite motivational talk was arranged for the students and Dr Gerard V Correa, Industrialist, Pharmacologist and a management trainer addressed the students on the occasion.

The two days tour was conceptualized by Prof. Melwin Rego, Dean of Humanities Faculty and the whole tour package was sponsored by him. He was accompanied by Dr Jayaram Shettigar, H.O.D of History, Mrs Annamma, H.O.D of Economics and Mrs Reshma, Assistant Professor of History and the Convener of Humanities Association. All the 22 students of final year BA, 17 women and 5 men participated in the tour.













EDUCATIONAL TOUR TO MANGALURU

The Department of Sociology of Milagres College, Kallianpur organized education tour to Mangaluru for IV Sem B.A students recently. They were accompanied by Prof. Melwin C Rego, H.O.D of Sociology. This tour was organized as part of their curricular activities.



They visited Aloyseum, recently opened heritage and archeological museum at St Aloysius College, Kodyalbail. Ms Kavitha, a B.A Alumnus of Milagres, currently in charge of the museum, guided the students on the various articles preserved in the museum. They also visited St Aloysius Chapel which is a well-known National Monument today.

Later they visited Mrs Nancy Mendonca's residence at Bendorewell for an insight on water harvesting system. Mrs Nancy Mendonca addressed the students on various issues related to the water shortage including the developmental activities which overlook need for water conservation. Inspired by her daughter who is an environment engineer at USA, Mrs Nancy Mendonca has installed water harvesting system at her residence harvesting rain water from the

roof to the well through the filtration tank. He inspired the students to popularise it amongst the general public. A practical demo of the system was held and the students found the well containing a considerable amount of water in this time of the year in spite of many wells in the neighbourhood.



They also visited Light House situated at Tagore park built in 18th Century by Hyder Ali and Tipu Sultan.



The students later visited historical Kadri temple. It is a spectacular temple dedicated to Lord Manjunatheshwara or Lord Shiva on Kadri hills. It depicts architectural marvels of early Vijayanagaradynasty dating back to 10th and 11th century AD.



They also paid a visit to Sri Gokarnanatheshwara temple at KudroliMangaluru. It was sanctified and consecrated by Brahmashree Narayana Guru in the year 1912. Devotees celebrate NavarathriUtsavwith attractive Shobha Yathra which ispopularly known asas "Mangaluru Dasara".

Students also visited a historical monument Sultan Battery, a watch tower constructed by Tipu Sultan in 1784. situated in the city. From here they had a wonderful experience of a boat ride to TannirBavi beach and back.



On the concluding part of the tour, students visited Kaup Light House situated on the rock alongside of the Kaupu beach. Games were organised for the students on the beach such as 100mts race, dog and bone and a short football match.



Martyr's Day:

On 30th January Martyr day was observed: floral tribute was offered to the portrait Mahatma Gandhi. Dr. Jayram Shettigar delivered special lecture on Gandhi contribution to World Peace. Faculty of Humanities has organized a National Level Seminar on ‘Indian Banking in the Era of Globalization and Information Technology’ on 15th March, 2019. Very Rev. Fr Dr Lawrence C. D’Souza, Correspondent of Milagres Educational Institutions presided over the function. Lion V.G Shetty, MJF, First vice District Governor, District 317 inaugurated the Seminar. Mr. Sujith Shetty, alumnus of our College and Zonal Sales Manager, DHFL, Bengaluru was the Guest of Honour. Dr. Basil V. Hans, Associate Professor and Head, Dept. Of Economics, St. Aloysius Evening College, Mangaluru was the Keynote Speaker. Prof. Melwin C. Rego, Dean of Faculty of humanities welcomed the gathering, Mr. Sandeep Shetty, Asst. Prof. Dept. Of Eng compeered the event and Prof. Annamma, Seminar Coordinator proposed vote of thanks.

Two Technical Sessions were organized. The first Technical Session was taken by Mr. Sujith Shetty who spoke on the topic ‘Prevention and Detection of Banking Frauds’. Mrs. Reshma Ass. Professor Post Graduarte Department of Social Work, Chaired the Session.

Second Technical Session was conducted by Mr. Shivprasad K, Senior Manager, Primacy Industries Ltd. Manipal. He Spoke on ‘Technological Advancement in Banking’ Mr. Pradeep J Moras Asst. Professor Department of Commerce Chaired the Session. Both the sessions were very informative and useful. Participants raised many questions and clarified their doubts.

About the Seminar : Banking as a tertiary activity is going through fast change and diversification under the

impact of globalization and information technology (IT). With its innovative growth the banking sector the "elephant" that is the Indian economy has emerged although it is facing certain challenges. Macroeconomic reforms coupled with the IT

Revolution in India have changed the phase of Indian banking industry to world class standards. IT adoption is not by chance but by choice. Altogether the new initiatives have contributed to "faster and more inclusive growth" in the country. However, the problems of rising NPAs, mergers & acquisitions, risk-based capital adequacy ratio, interest rate reduction, digital divide etc need exceptional attention and measures both technical and institutional. Prudent macro policies in

general and financial reforms in particular are necessary for stability.

In this background the Seminar on Indian Banking in the Era of Globalization and Information Technology is expected to

generate useful debate on emerging issues of banking and finance in India. Hence we look forward to research-based, thought-provoking papers related to the Seminar theme and sub themes. Banking in India: A Historical Perspective, Emerging issues and Challenges in Banking Industry, Indian Banking - Managing Transformation, Banking and Women Empowerment, Banking For Financial Inclusion of Farmers, New Age Banking - Problems and Prospects, Future of Cooperative Banks, Role of Technology in Rural Banking, Reforms in Industrial Finance in India, E-banking and Green Banking in India, Role of Foreign Banks in India, Banking for Entrepreneurship Development, New HRM Practices in Banks.

The seminar is open to academicians, research scholars, students from the disciplines of Humanities, Commerce and Management, Computer Science, NGO's, Bankers, Policy Makers and the general public.

All together 84 Papers were presented (58 teachers & 26 research scholars and students). Nearly 200 participants were registered from 30 different colleges from Karnataka and neighbouring states and they actively participated in the deliberations of the Seminar.
