Then they also visited Sharavathi Kandla Mangroves Honnavara where the Mangroves Boardwalk offered a unique opportunity to explore the diverse ecosystem of mangrove forests in a protected and accessible environment.









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Industrial Visit: The commerce department of Milagres College Kallianpur organized an industrial visit to GURUCHARAN INDUSTRIES in the Baikampady industrial area on 5th May 2024. 66 students of Final BCom with 4 faculty members were present.. This visit was for students of final year B.Com and aimed to provide practical knowledge about the inside of an industry, its working and divisions. Mr Danraj, Marketing department, explained about the drilling, tapping and threading machine. He practically showed work, where students saw the threading of spare parts and how the dust is collected using a magnet. Later we were also shown knife grinding, and surface grinding with the help of a leth machine, which had an accuracy of 60 micro leth that released dust in 2 minutes. He also explained the preface of the company that was promoted by Jayakar Shettigar in the year 1996 to manufacture plastic processing machines, allied machinery, spare parts and components of plastic processing and allied machinery







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1. Pre training for Industrial Visit. Department of Commerce has organized a pre training session on Induastrial visit on 5th May 2024 for final BCom students. Mr Karthik Nayak, convener of Career Guidance and Placement Cell was the resource person. 

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Nature Camp Report

Objectives

Report on Village Exposure Programme

Department of English, in association with IQAC, organized village exposure programme on 27th April and 28th April 2024. 33 students from II BCOM, II BCA, and III BA actively participated in this two-day camp held at Balkidru, Brahmavar.

On the first day, students embarked on an industrial visit to gain practical insights into factory operations. The village of Balkidru housed two factories: a chemical product factory and Cochin Shipyard Limited.

On 27th evening students were divided into teams and sent to selected houses to experience village life first hand. They interacted with villagers, asked questions about their traditions, folklore, and facilities provided by the Gram Panchayat. Additionally, students raised awareness about sustainable practices such as solar energy utilization, rainwater harvesting, and waste management techniques like worm composting. This exchange of knowledge was well received by the villagers, and students gained valuable insights into rural life.

The students were instructed to prepare a detailed report on their experiences, which they shared the following day at a gathering held in the Government School Hangarkatte. Each team shared their findings and experiences, highlighting the positive impact of the programme. Subsequently, students collaborated to prepare and cook meals, fostering a sense of community and fellowship on the next day.

Overall, the village exposure program was a resounding success, providing students with a deeper understanding of rural life and an opportunity to engage meaningfully with the community.

















